

Is the Cause of General Grief About
New London.

Arthur Hayworth, one of the influential well-to-do farmers of Monroe township, died at his late home, Saturday, at about 4:30 o'clock of typhoid fever, aged about 56 years.

The funeral took place at the Friends' church at New London, today, at 10 o'clock, conducted by Rev. Jubue Reagan.

He is survived by a widow and four children, three sons and one daughter. He owned a splendid farm, a half mile west of New London. He was a cousin of Prof. Clarence Hayworth, of this city, and a brother of Disbou Hayworth, of Greentown, and Frank Hayworth, of New London.
